Reading You can read:


- Your Scheme Reader or Library Book

- Non-fiction books, information texts, recipe books

Make sure that an adult signs your Reading Record every time you read so that you can claim your House Points.



Practise your times tables

- Write, cover, check
- Forwards, backwards, mixed up
- Ask someone to test you
- Roll a dice and multiply the numbers



Learn spellings

- Look, say, cover, write, check
 - Ask someone to test you
 - Is there a spelling rule that helps?
 - Identify the tricky part & a way to remember it
- Don't forget spelling tests are every **Friday***

Bigger Treats

Wonderful Writing (choose 1)

- 1) Write a story about a family holiday to Spain. How did you get there, who did you meet, what did you see?
- 2) Write a postcard from a favourite holiday destination. Talk about the weather or the food and draw a picture.

Magnificent Maths (choose 1)

- 1) Invent your own maths game to help you to learn double numbers and halves within 100: e.g. 3+3, 3x6 .
- 2) Create your own 'pairs' card game where the players have to match words and numbers: e.g. one and 1, three and 3.
Make sure your game has rules!

Light and seeing (choose 1)

- 1) On a sunny day, watch the shadows in your garden. Draw a picture or write how they change through the day. Can you explain why?
- 2) Experiment with different materials or clothes at home – which one lets the light through and which reflect light? Can you say why? How could you record your ideas?

Poster Perfect (choose 1)

Design a poster for either of these topics:

- 1) to show how to be seen best at night – think about the colours and materials that you might need to wear.
 - 2) to help younger children when they are choosing a book to read from the school library
- Make your poster big, bright and eye-catching!

Amazing Arts and Crafts (choose 1)

- 1) Design and make a mosaic of an animal shape to go on a Spanish building like the architect Gaudi.
- 2) Make a shadow puppet to use when telling a story – why not use characters from George's Marvellous Medicine?

Your 3 Bigger Treats must be completed and in school by **Thursday 19th October** ready for our Class Exhibition. You can complete Bigger Treats on larger pieces of paper or using ICT if this is easier. If you need help with research or are stuck in any way, tell your teacher in plenty of time!
