We will check Reading Records every Monday.</i></p>	<p>Wonderful Writing (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Write an adventure story with a beginning, middle and end. Try to use lots of exciting vocabulary and expanded noun phrases. E.g. In the deep, dark forest he spotted the hairy, hideous creatures and bravely drew out his sword. Challenge: Can you write a full page of A4.2) Write a rhyming poem. E.g. The fish had a wish. The cat chased the rat. The mouse lived in a tiny house.	
<p>Practise your 2 times tables.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- counting in 5's forwards and backwards.- 5 times table games on the internet.- Listen to 5 times table songs.- Roll a dice and multiply the numbers	<p>Magnificent maths (choose 1)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Start telling the time at home using an analogue clock (quarter past/quarter to and then in 5 minute intervals e.g 10 minutes past six).2) Find 1 more and 1 less than a number to 100 E.g. 15 1 more =16 1 less =143) Find 10 more and 10 less than a number to 100 E.g. 25 10 more = 35 10 less = 15	
<p>Learn spellings</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Look, say, cover, write, check- Ask someone to test you- Is there a spelling rule that helps?- Identify the tricky part & a way to remember it <p><i>Don't forget spelling tests are every Friday.
