Absence

We wanted to take this opportunity to talk to you about attendance. We know it seems obvious, but if a child is not in school, they cannot learn. During the pandemic we know that schooling was hugely disrupted. The Government recognise this and have introduced statutory legislation that sets out the responsibilities of everyone in our school community with regards to attendance.

We have copied a couple of paragraphs from the Government paper below. Please feel free to follow the links to the documents in full.

"The law entitles every child of compulsory school age to an efficient, full-time education suitable to their age, aptitude, and any special educational need they may have. It is the legal responsibility of every parent to make sure their child receives that education either by attendance at a school or by education otherwise than at a school.

Where parents decide to have their child registered at school, they have an additional legal duty to ensure their child attends that school regularly. This means their child must attend every day that the school is open, except in a small number of allowable circumstances such as being too ill to attend or being given permission for an absence in advance from the school."

Next week we will write to all parents about every child's attendance for the first part of the Autumn Term.

Where attendance is above 95% we will be congratulating you and asking you to keep it up; where it is between 90% and 95% the letter will recognise that, at this early stage of the year just a couple of days can make all the difference, but also ask you to keep an eye on things to try to help improve the attendance; where attendance is below 90% the letter will explain that we will formally monitor your child's attendance as (while, again, we know that a few days at this early stage can make all the difference) children's whose attendance remains consistently below 90% are classed as 'persistently absent' and this can have a marked effect on children's attainment and progress.

This is a process that we will repeat at the end of each short term so that you can remain fully informed about your child's attendance levels.

We know that it is not pleasant to receive a letter about your child's lateness or attendance, but we have a statutory duty to ensure we have clear and robust processes in place to help manage attendance. There are thresholds which automatically trigger different stages of the attendance procedures.

I am a parent, and my daughter was quite poorly at different times throughout last academic year. I received a letter which is very similar to the ones that will be sent out next week. It wasn't nice and I was initially quite upset as it was all due to illness. However, I also know that it is highly unlikely that her absence will remain low, so I know I just had to accept that it was the school's responsibility to send it. I would fully expect to be challenged if her absence remained low.

We will always seek to support families to overcome barriers in order to get all children into school, but we are dutybound to tell you of the possible consequences of ongoing absence.

I hope this helps to clarify why letters have to be sent out.


We're celebrating Maths Week England by taking part in a friendly times tables (and division) competition. The competition runs from 07:30 GMT Monday 14th November to 19:30 GMT Wednesday 16th November. It's all done online via play.ttrockstars.com.

Children can play in any gamemode with every correct answer to a multiplication or division question, earning themselves, their class and the school a point. The Times Tables Rock Stars platform will calculate the class average (the number of correct answers per pupil in the class who play during the competition hours, subject to a daily 60-minute limit. Winning classes in the school and in the competition as a whole will be the ones with the highest average.

To support player wellbeing, there is a daily time limit of 60-minutes per player. In other words, each player can earn competition points for up to 60-minutes between 07:30 GMT and 19:30 GMT on 07:30 GMT Monday 14th November to 19:30 GMT Wednesday 16th November. Once the player goes beyond 60-minutes of play on that day, they will still earn coins but will no longer earn points towards the competition.

In the spirit of the competition, please don't play on their behalf but by all means encourage and support them to the extent that it doesn't cause high stress levels or impact on family plans.
