We like to acknowledge the children's birthdays in school and encourage them to wear a birthday badge and share their news with the class. We ask that children bring a water bottle into school containing water only. This is for a number of reasons.

- Water so not to attract flies or create sticky desks.
- Water to promote healthy choices.

We do understand that some children do not like water. Therefore, we suggest children bring a squash drink for their lunch break but ask that you encourage your child to try water during lesson times. If it is not possible for them to do this please let the school office know so that we can let teachers know of exceptional circumstances.


The children have all come back to school looking exceptionally smart. Thank you so much for supporting this.
