
Wonderful Writing (choose 1)

- 1) Retell your favourite story. Can you use exciting descriptive vocabulary and expanded noun phrases. Who is in the story? Where are they? What will they do? When will it happen? Write a beginning, middle with a problem and solution and an ending. **Challenge:** use suffixes – words ending in ful, ness, ly, ment or less.
- 2) Write sentences using the Y2 Common Exception words (they are on the back of your reading record). **Challenge:** use conjunctions to extend sentences (or, and, but, so, because, when, if, that)

Magnificent maths (choose 1)

- 1) Make amounts using coins – how many ways can you make 25p, 79p or £1 and 73p.
- 2) Giving change from 20p– make some money labels and play shop, work out change by finding the difference. E.g. I bought some sweets for 11p and I paid with 20p. What is the difference between 20 and 11? Solve using pictures or by counting back on a number line.

Challenge: give change from amounts up to 50p then any amount up to £1



Super Science

- 1) Investigate the suitability of materials. Predict which material would be the most suitable to make a waterproof coat for Paddington and then test the materials. Which material would make a good waterproof coat and why? Was your prediction correct? List your materials, write your prediction and then write your results.



Poster Perfect

- 1) Design a fire safety poster, telling people how to stay safe and what to do in an emergency.

Amazing Arts and Crafts

- 1) Create your own colourful art using a ruler. Here are some examples.
