
Reading You can read:

- Your Scheme Reader or Library Book

Practise your times tables

- Write, cover, check

- Identify the tricky part & a way to remember it

Bigger Treats Term 3

Wonderful Writing (choose 1)

- 1) In Victorian times poor children had to work as soon as they could walk. Imagine you are a child working in a factory or down a mine. Write a diary entry, explaining what a day at work was like!
- 2) Write a story set in Victorian times. Maybe your character is poor and lives on the streets of London. What might happen if your character is caught stealing food? Your story should be 1 to 2 pages long.

Magnificent Maths (choose 1)

- 1) Make a board or card game for children to practise their 6, 7 and 9 times table facts. You could make a game of 'pairs' or a board game where when you land on a particular square you have to work out a times table fact.

Super Science (choose 1)

- 1) The Victorians were great inventors! Invent your own time-saving device i.e. a homework machine or a device for tidying your bedroom. Draw and label a diagram showing how your machine works.
- 2) Design a mini leaflet explaining an important discovery by a Victorian scientist e.g. electric lights, telephones.

Poster Perfect (choose 1)

Design a poster for any of these topics:

- 1) Comparing school in Victorian times to school today. What is different? (Children writing on slates with chalk) What is the same? (Children learnt their times tables).
- 2) To advertise a trip to the seaside during Victorian times. How would you get there? Think of all the things you could do – stroll along the promenade, puppet shows, donkey rides!

Make sure that your poster is colourful and eye-catching!

Amazing Arts and Crafts (choose 1)

- 1)  Make your own toy that might have been played with in Victorian times – for example a peg doll, a kite or a spinning top.
- 2) Postage stamps were first invented in Victorian times. Design your own set of 4 postage stamps. Choose a theme i.e. favourite animals, sportspeople, characters from a story or a game.

Any completed tasks should be in school/sent via Teams by Monday 8th February 2021. You can complete Bigger Treats on larger pieces of paper or using ICT if this is easier. Photos of projects can be uploaded onto Teams using the assignment tab.
