Uniform and Other Belongings in School

A reminder to please remember to name all items of clothing including coats, jumpers, cardigans, sun hats, lunch boxes and water bottles. This makes it easier for staff to reunite children with lost belongings.

Iewellerv

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are not allowed to wear jewellery or watches, this includes earrings. These should be removed before coming to school.

Children in Years 3 to 6 are only allowed to wear a watch and one pair of stud earrings. Earrings must be removed by the child for PE. If your child is unable to remove earrings themselves, they should be removed before they come to school.

Class Birthday Parties

Home Learning

In the coming weeks we will be introducing the children and yourselves to our online learning platform – Microsoft Teams. Many of you may already know and use the platform for work. Staff are currently undertaking training and we will then be sharing this with yourselves.

As we all become more confident in using the platform, we will use it to set homework and, In the event of having to learn from home again due to Coronavirus, this will be the platform that we will use to set work and communicate.

Whilst this is being set up, if your child is well but needs to isolate due to family members or to await test results we will send home a sheet of suggested website and activities you can use to support them to learn at home. This will be sent home via email once you inform us of the reason your child is needed to isolate. Please contact the school if you require any support with this.

Working together as a school and parents will produce the very best outcomes for your child and we thank you again for all the support you give to the school.

<u>Parking</u>

The Desborough Fire Service have been out on parking patrols this week and have found it very difficult to get through with the fire engine.

Could we remind parents that they should not:

- park within 10 metres of a junction
- be double parked
- park on the double yellow lines or on the school zig zags

Please be reminded that if there is a fire or accident near to the schools access is required for all emergency vehicles to get to the scene as quick and as safe as possible. If you are parking in a way that they cannot get through you are putting peoples lives at risk and action will be taken against you in the way of tickets being issued and on vehicles being removed for obstruct

<u>Cold/Adverse Weather</u>

With the weather turning wetter and colder, please ensure your child has a waterproof coat (preferably with a hood) with them every day. All children go outside during break times and lunchtimes unless the weather is bad.



Scheme Reader Amnesty

Thank you for returning so many library and scheme readers to school – this has really helped us to relaunch reading with the children.

Unfortunately, we are still missing a large number of Dark Red scheme readers (books with a dark red sticker over the spine and Stage 16 on the back cover) which means that not all of the children on this level are able to read a scheme reader currently as we do not have enough to go around. If you have a child in Phase 3 (Years 4, 5 and 6), please help us out by having another look at home for Dark Red scheme readers – we would massively appreciate any you find being returned to school.

Home Reading expectations

Now that the children have settled into school, we are keen to encourage a daily reading habit at home. Research shows that even 5 minutes of daily reading practise quickly builds a child's vocabulary and develops their confidence across all subject areas. Please remember to sign your child's Reading Record every time they read; this could be their scheme reader, a library book or any other book that they are enjoying at home. Thank you for your support.
